Overview of PPSG – 2022-23

Objectives of spending PPSG:

- To improve the provision of PE at St Edwards Catholic First School

- Broaden the sporting opportunities and experiences available to pupils
- To develop a passion for a range of different sports and promote physical activity

Focus of spending the PPSG Grant

- Encouraging healthy and active lifestyles through giving children the opportunity to engage in physical activity, movement and exercise.
- Increasing young people's well-being as well as developing their creativity and resourcefulness.
- Helping children develop key abilities such as hand-eye co-ordination.
- Encouraging children to interact with one another make new friends and develop social skills.
- Allowing children to experience new challenges assess risks and manage difficult situations in a safe and supervised environment.
- Encouraging psychological growth such as confidence and independence.
- Supporting the development of life skills such as problem solving, rule making, trial and error, winning and losing and exploring new ways of doing things.

Outcomes

- Where appropriate, all children will reach at least age expected levels in PE by the end of each academic year.
- All children in KS1 and KS2 will represent the school at least once per year at an inter-school tournament.
- Children will participate and enjoy a wide range and variety of sports that they may otherwise not have experienced.
- Children will participate in regular periods of activity and enjoy a more varied range of activities
- Children will become more confident and their self-esteem and independence will grow
- Teachers are encouraged to plan more varied lessons and deliver them more confidently.
